# Literacy and Numeracy NCEA testing for Year 11 to 13 students:

For students who do not have all of the reading, writing or numeracy standards required for the NCEA co-requisite and Year 11 Diploma, testing will be taking place across September 19 to 20. Students involved have been notified and will receive an exam timetable that they can access in PC School closer to the testing date.

A reminder for all students to check they have set up their NZQA login and done the approved device checking process well in advance of the day. Students have been working through this process in their tutor classes across this week.

#### **Entrance Exams Year 12 and 13:**

Exams for Year 12 and 13 students begin on Thursday the 12th September and run through to Friday 20th September. All students will receive an individualised timetable that they access through PC School, with their examination room and time. Attendance to all exams is compulsory. Given the importance of these exams and the opportunity they provide to give students feedback prior to the November NCEA exams, students who do not attend without a justified reason will be followed up on by senior staff.

While the entrance exams are running, all Year 9, 10 and 11 classes operate as normal, although room change will occur to accommodate examinations.
